As a graduate of Morrisville State College with a degree in Renewable Resources, Erick has a well-rounded background in Dairy and Crop Farming, Environmental Planning, GPS/GIS, Integrated Pest Management, Whole Farm Planning, and Forest Management. Erick is also a Certified Crop Advisor and a Master Forest Owner.



Maria Harrison is the William H. Crocker Professor at Boyce Thompson Institute and Adjunct Professor in the School of Integrative Plant Science (SIPS) at Cornell University. Her successful scientific program and influential research publications earned her the honor of being included by Thomson Reuters in its list of 2016's most highly cited researchers. Harrison is a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science (2012) and the American Academy for Microbiology (2013). In April 2019, she was elected to the National Academy of Sciences.
